1.	Have you moved furniture away from windows to keep small children from climbing up and falling out of the window?		
2.	Do you test your smoke alarm once a month?		
3.	Do you have working smoke alarms in all bedrooms and one in the hallway outside the bedrooms?		
4.	Have you decided on one meeting place outside your home in case of a fire or other emergency?		
5.	Are all the matches and lighters locked away from children?		
6.	If you have a fireplace, is it cleaned every year?		
7.	Do you change the filter in your furnace every three months?		
8.	Are you using multi-plugs with a circuit breaker instead of extension cords?		
9.	If you use a portable heater, is it plugged directly into a wall outlet?		
10.	Do you have your emergency disaster bag ready to go?
